

HOW TO GET THERE

Endon is on the A53, 4 miles from Leek on the road to Stoke-on-Trent. It's on the Hanley to Leek bus route, stopping at The Plough.

Endon with Stanley Parish

The parish covers 2,500 acres (1,000 ha) most of which is agricultural land. There are over 1300 houses, occupied by more than 3,000 people.

The Caldon Canal and a branch line of the former North Staffordshire Railway both run through the valley. The canal is now used for pleasure craft and the railway may be reopened for freight.

There are more than 19 miles of public rights of way in the parish. Shops are located at Stockton Brook, along Leek Road and in Station Road.

You can see more information about the parish on the sign boards [S] by the post box opposite the Methodist Church (top of Station Rd.) and at the bus stop near the petrol station. There is also a board on the new Stockton Brook Canal Bridge which was rebuilt in 2000.

FOLLOW THE COUNTRY CODE:

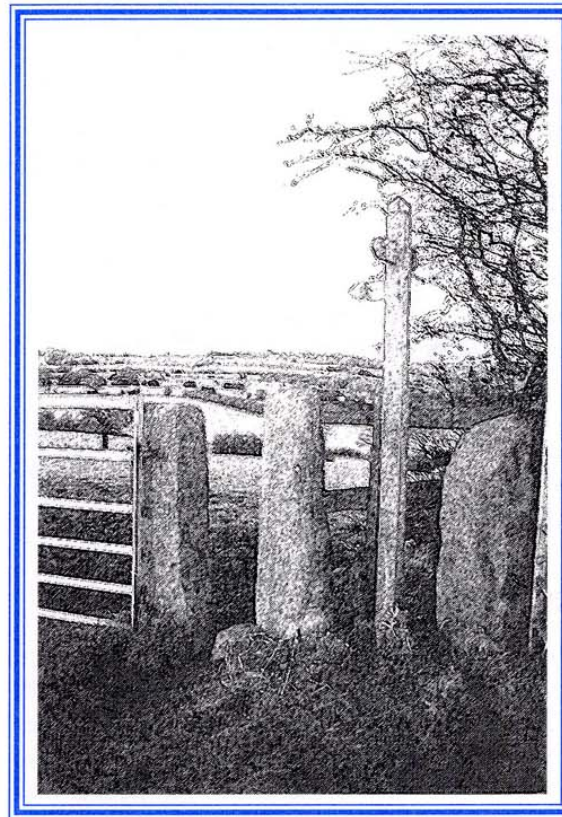
- Leave livestock, crops and machinery alone.
