Nicholson Gallery

The Nicholson Gallery is housed within the Nicholson Institute and is a living example of late Victorian philanthropy. Textile industrialist Joshua Nicholson commissioned the building which was opened on 16th October 1884 and gifted to the public. As well as the Art Gallery the building contained library faculties and education reading rooms and it is still being used for these purposes. Built by architect William Sugden in the Queen Anne style it incorporates the 'Arts and Crafts Movement' influences. Guided tours can be arranged for a minimum of four people. 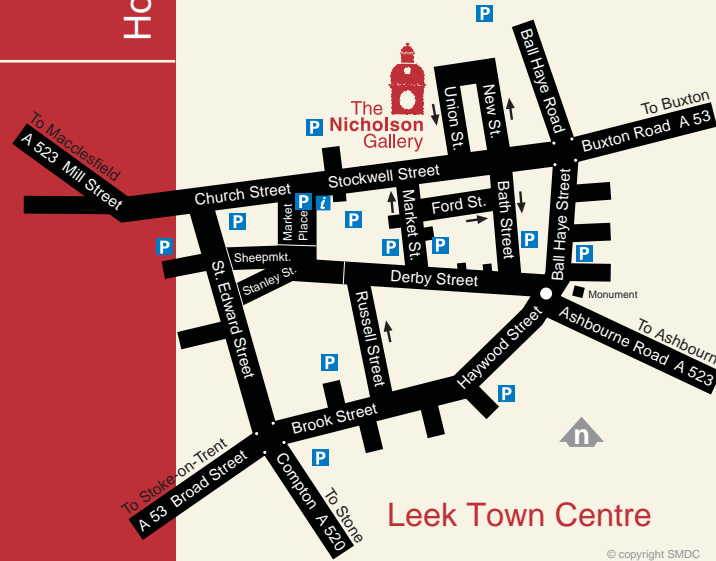

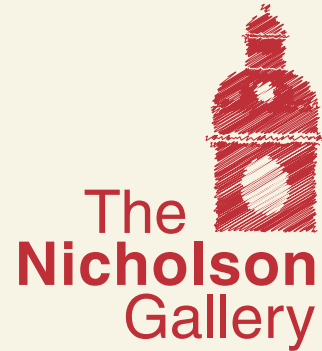
