### **Important Notice**

The application must be signed by the ratepayer. Where, for example, the ratepayer is a company or partnership, it should be signed by a director of that company or one of the partners and the person signing should state his capacity. It is a criminal offence for a ratepayer to give false information when making an application for Relief.

Changes of circumstances should be declared promptly. Failure to report a change within 4 weeks will result in the loss of relief.

### Additional Information

The occupier of a property in a settlement, appearing in a billing authority's rural settlement list is entitled to rate relief if it is the only such property of that type in that settlement and its rateable value is £7,000 or less changing to £8,500 with effect from  $1^{st}$  April 2010 (£10,500 in the case if a Public House and Petrol Filling Station, changing to £12,500 with effect from  $1^{st}$  April 2010). The relief given is now 100% as of the  $1^{st}$  April 2017.

Authorities also have discretion to remit all or part of the rate bill on other properties in a settlement on the rural settlement list if the rateable value is £14,000 or less, changing to £16,500 with effect from  $1^{st}$  April 2010, and the local authority is satisfied that the property is used for a purpose which benefits the local community.
