Staffordshire Safer Neighbourhood Panels

Safer Neighbourhood Panels are made up of local residents, local councillors and magistrates who meet regularly with their area's local policing commander.



The panels influence and shape local policing and shine the spotlight on the work being done by police in their area to ensure greater transparency and help build public confidence.

Panel members receive training to help them carry out their role so that they can be involved in innovative work such as examining body camera footage captured during "stop and searches" by local officers.

There are lots of different ways in which you can volunteer through the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner!

Ethics, Transparency and Audit Panel (ETAP)

The ETAP is made up of members of the public, who test the accuracy of crime recording, examines the response of police to incidents and analyses the way they handle complaints about policing.



Independent Custody Visitors (ICVs)

ICVs check on the wellbeing of people being held in custody by the police. ICVs make a minimum of six to eight visits per year and always conduct their visits in pairs.



Mystery Shoppers

Mystery Shoppers visit police front desks, make calls to the non -emergency 101 number and seek information on the force's website. Their feedback – positive or negative – gives an honest picture of police customer service and highlight where things are being done well or where improvement is needed.
