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

To Congleton

Leek Markets With a charter dating back over 800 years, the local markets are steeped in history and tradition. Enjoy the hustle and bustle as you immerse yourself in the unique atmosphere of traditional markets

Nicholson Museum, Art Gallery & TIC Free Entry. Dating back to the 1880s the Nicholson Museum and Art Gallery dominates the skyline of Leek and today is home to a collection of oil paintings, ceramics, local nistory and a fine selection of the famous Leek Embroideries

Brindlev's Mill Built by James Brindlev. the great canal engineer, in 1752, now a working water-powered corn mill and museum dedicated to his life and achievements

Brough Park Situated close to the centre of Leek. It offers spectacular views north towards the Roaches and Hen Cloud. During the summer months many events and outdoor concerts are held in the park.

Rudyard Lake Once a popular Victorian resort, today it caters for visitors who come to walk, fish, sail, row, canoe, pird watch and rid the miniature train.

The Roaches Impressive gritstone edges and craggy rocks loved by walkers and climbers. Home to one of Britain's favourite views. The Roaches is a rocky outcrop that rises above the tranquil waters of Tittesworth Reservoir located between Leek and Buxton.

The Manifold Valley A spectacular limestone gorge, once Goldenhill Brown Edge the route of the Leek & Manifold Valley Light Railway. Today it is an easy to follow track, To Stoke-on-Trent accessible for all. The track running through

the Manifold Valley winds its way through some of the most spectacular scenery in the Peak District National Park.

The Churnet Valley A hidden gem with an industrial heritage that today is home to beautiful countryside and wildlife centres, not forgetting Alton Towers! It is dotted with small villages and nature reserves, along with some particularly picturesque sections of the Caldon Canal. For lovers of steam trains, the Churnet Valley Railway runs steam and historic diesel trains between Leekbrook Junction and Froghall.
